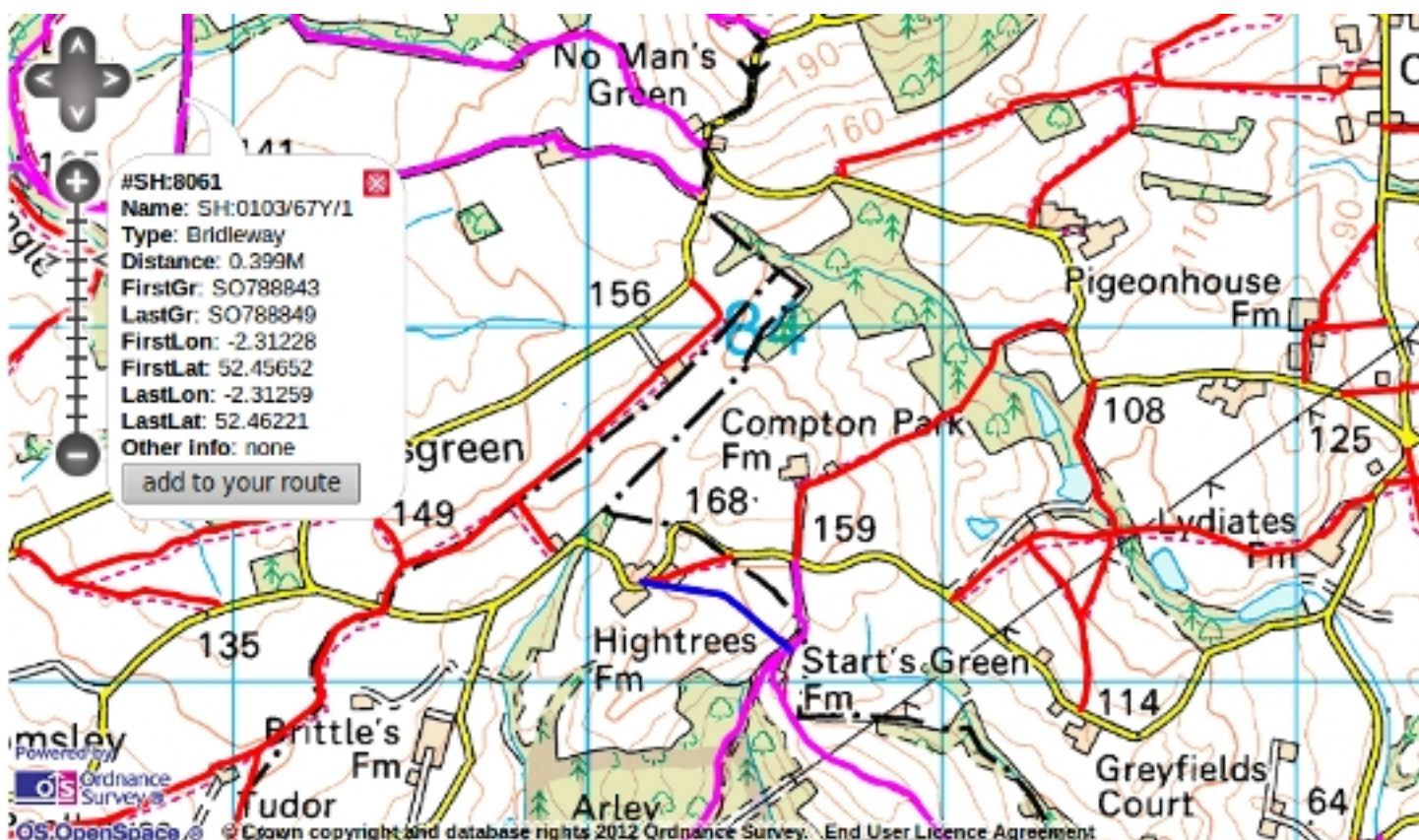
The web site www.rowmaps.com can display maps showing rights of way. It currently has data for: Devon, East Sussex, Hampshire, Hertfordshire, Norfolk, Oxfordshire, Shropshire, Staffordshire, Wiltshire, Worcestershire
Other areas will be added when the data becomes available.

The underlying map can be from the Ordnance Survey, OpenStreetMap, Google or Bing.

There is an example of a map below. The coloured lines that have been superimposed on this map show the rights of way that are in this area:

red	footpath
fuchsia	bridleway
green	restricted byway
blue	byway open to all traffic

The pop-up shows an example of the information you will get if you click on one of the rights of way.



This map shows how www.rowmaps.com copes seamlessly with a mix of counties. The black dot-dashed line shows the boundary between Shropshire (left), Staffordshire (right) and Worcestershire (bottom middle).

You can ask for a map that is close to a specific place. And once you've done that, there are details about how you could include such a map on your own web page. You can also build a route for a walk, run, etc., by selecting several rights of way and having established a route you can ask for it to be output in KML or GPX.
